Energy Assistance

Energy Services for Columbia County will be at Lodi City Hall on the following dates for customers to apply for Energy Assistance.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 9TH, 1 PM – 3 PM

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 4TH, 9 AM – NOON

Appointments are required. Please call 1-800-506-5596 to reserve your time. If the phone is busy, choose option 1 and leave a message for someone to return your call.

After Hour Emergencies

If you have an after-hours emergency for Electric, Water or Sewer, please call (608) 258-0027. This number should only be used for emergencies.

Tax Roll of Past Due Balances

Municipally owned public utilities are authorized to collect unpaid charges by placing the charges on the tax roll, as a lien on the property served.

The procedure begins with giving notice by October 15th to the owner and/or occupant of each parcel of land in which payment is in arrears as of October 1st. If the balance remains unpaid as of Nov 15th, the amount will become a lien on the property and be collected as a special assessment on this year's tax bill.

Electric Rate Increase

The Public Service Commission has approved a rate increase for Lodi Utilities' customers to cover increased costs to operate the local utility and distribute reliable, local power. The last increase was approved in 2013.

The average residential customer using 638 kWh per month will see a monthly increase of approximately \$2.26, or 2.8%. The increase will be effective on October 1, 2018. The new rates will be reflected in the November bills.

Fall Leaf Pick Up

Leaf pick up in the City of Lodi will again be available. City workers will circulate the City on a weekly basis picking up leaves. Please rake leaves (no garden waste, animal waste, brush or stones should be mixed in) to the curb, but NOT into the street or on sidewalks. Workers will not pick up leaves outside of the city limits.

Burning of leaves is prohibited within the City. You may also dispose of leaves, grasses, and garden waste at the City compost site on Highway K. ***There is not a set schedule for leaf pick up.*** Please check our website at www.cityoflodi.us for additional information.



In-Person Absentee Voting

In-person absentee voting is currently underway in the municipal clerks' office at Lodi City Hall for the November 6th General Election.

Hours: Monday-Friday from 7:30 AM- 4:00 PM. The last day to in-person absentee vote is Friday, November 2 until 5:00 pm. Photo ID is required.

Polls will be open from 7 AM–8 PM on Election Day. If you are not registered, please register on-line at www.myvote.wi.gov or you may register at the Clerk's Office in City Hall.
